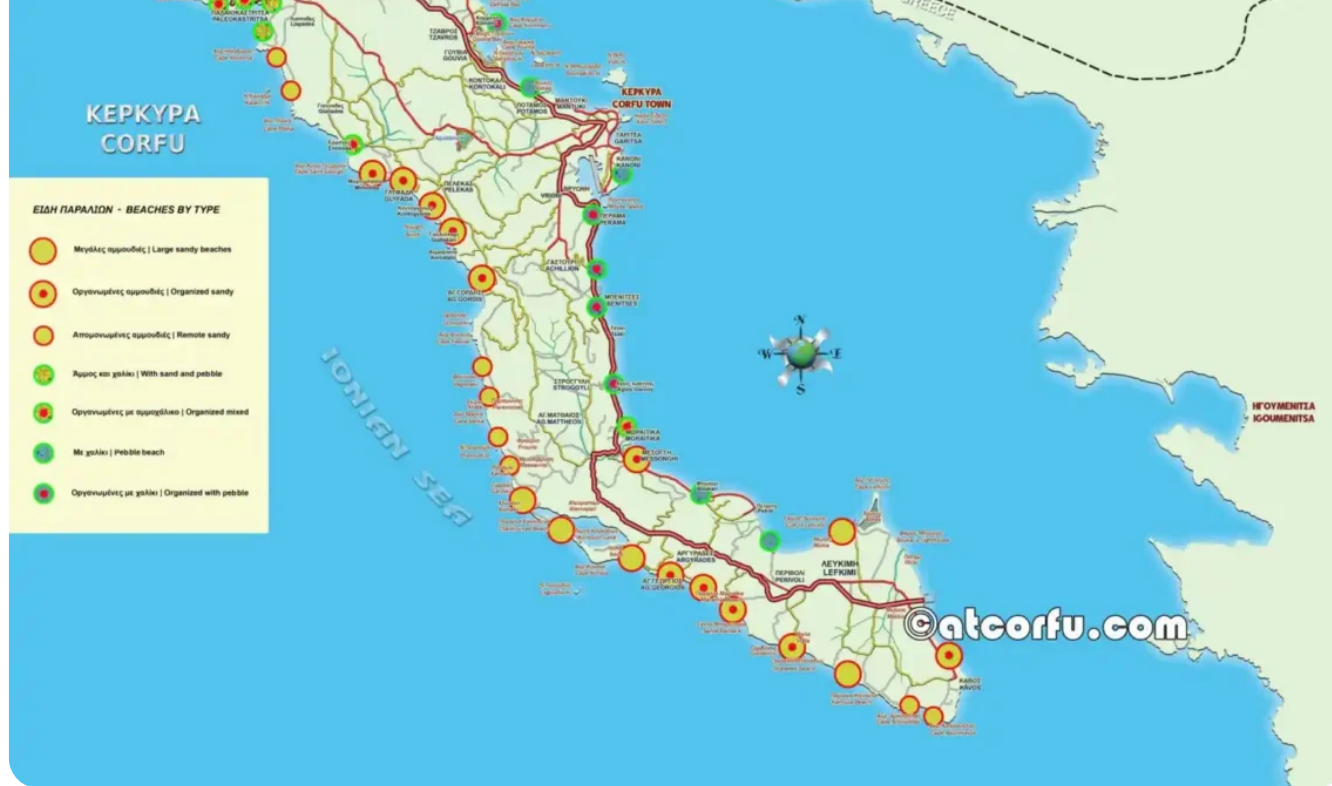

East vs West: What to Expect

Corfu's coastline tells two different stories, depending on which side of the island you're on:

West Coast Beaches

-  Wild, dramatic, and stunning at sunset.
-  Often wider, with waves ideal for water sports.
-  Features iconic spots like Glyfada, Pelekas, and Chalikounas.
-  Better for exploration and nature escapes.

East Coast Beaches

- ☀️ Sheltered from strong winds.
- 🌊 Calm, crystal-clear waters — perfect for families and children.
- 🌴 Narrower beaches with fine pebbles or sand.
- 🚤 Ideal for boat hires, snorkelling, and peaceful swims.
- 🏠 Closer to Corfu Town and many resorts.

📌 Beaches by Region

If you want to plan around your base or explore different parts of the island, here's how the beaches break down by area:

- **North Corfu:** Sidari, Canal d'Amour, Roda, Acharavi, Apraos, Agios Spiridon, Kassiopi area.
Good for unique rock formations, family fun, and shallow waters.
- **Northwest Corfu:** Arillas, Agios Stefanos NW, Saint George, Loggas.
More laid-back, with incredible sunsets and wide sandy shores.
- **West Corfu:** Ermones, Glyfada, Pelekas, Kontogialos, Mirtiotissa, Hidden beaches close to Paleokastritsa (Rovinia), Agios Gordis, Chalikounas, Issos.
Best for surfers, long sandy beaches, and scenic landscapes, although some are remote or secluded.
- **South Corfu:** Vitalades, Saint George South, Gardenos, Marathias, Arkoudilas, Kavos.
Very large sandy stretches, Peaceful and more remote — great for couples and relaxation.
- **East Corfu:** Messonghi, Moraitika, Agios Ioannis Peristeron, Benitses south, Barbati, Dassia, Ipsos, Kalami, Kerasia.
Easy access, organized beaches, calm waters, and a lush backdrop.

- **Near Corfu Town:** Mon Repos, Anemomylos, Faliraki.

Perfect for a quick dip without leaving town.

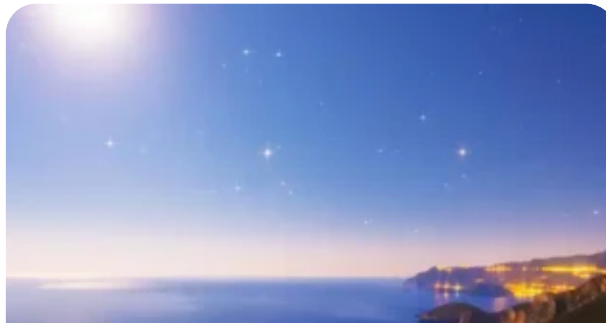
Agios Ioannis Peristeron Beach in Corfu, Greece

Paleokastritsa Beaches & 7 Nearby Secluded Paradises

West coast, 25 km from Corfu Town. A mix of pebble and sandy beaches, to name a few: Rovinia, Limni, Chomi, Stelari, are popular with tourists. Boat trips and diving.

Benitses Beaches in the Tsaki Southern area

12 km south of Corfu Town. Pebble beaches with traditional tavernas. Family-friendly and peaceful. With the beaches of the main settlement and plenty of small, peaceful coves to the south, in the Tsaki area.

West coast, south of Pelekas. Secluded, surrounded by cliffs. Mostly sandy. Historically nudist-friendly.

East coast, 22 km from Corfu Town. Sandy, shallow waters. Great for families and kids.

Agios Georgios (Saint George South) Beach at Argyrades

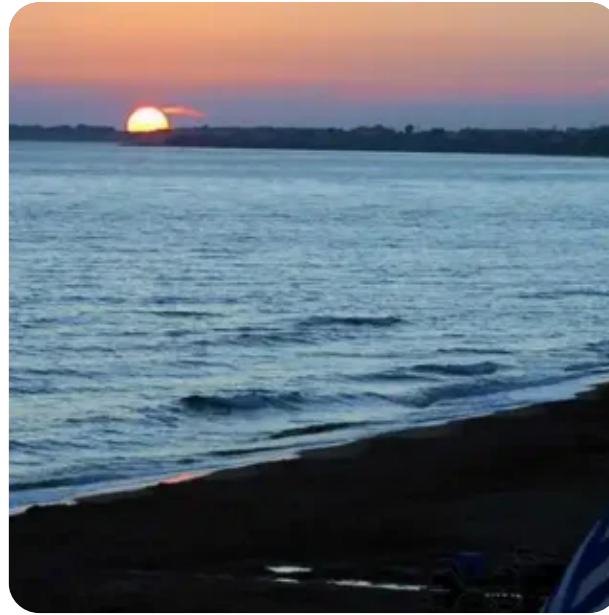

North coast. Famous for the rock formations and coves. Sandy beaches. Popular with tourists and couples.

North coast. Long sandy-pebble mix, organized. Ideal for families and accessible for all.

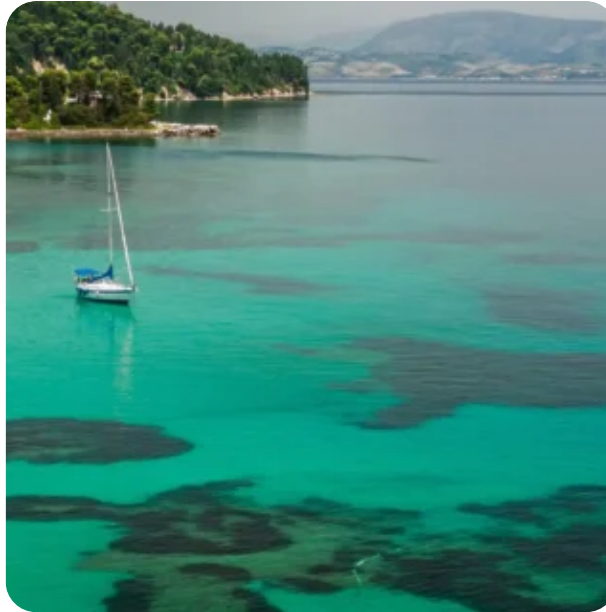
Peroulades Village & Loggas Beach With Majestic Cliffs

Not a beach, but it overlooks Glyfada. Great for sunsets and near sandy beaches. The beach of Kontogialos lies just under the village, which is perched on the mountain.

Northeast coast. Small pebble beach, very clear water. Great for snorkeling and couples.

Moraitika Corfu Family-Friendly Beach and Village Vibes

East coast, ~20 km from Corfu Town. Sandy with shallow entry. Resorts and water sports are available.

Kavos Beach: A Corfu Hotspot for Young British Tourists

Southern tip. Sandy beach, loud nightlife. Suited for party-goers, less for families.

Ipsos Corfu – Beach, Bars & Nightlife by the Sea

East coast, 14 km from Corfu Town. Pebble Beach, organized. Youth-oriented nightlife and water sports.

Gouvia Beach in Corfu Yachting Marina & Venetian Arsenal



Gouvia Beach

Near Corfu Town. Small beach near the marina. Good for short stays, not the best swimming. Just next to the ruins of the Venetian Arsenal.

Glyfada Beach, Corfu: A Vibrant Sandy Resort

West coast, ~16 km from town. Golden sandy beach, very popular. Good for families, young crowds.

West coast, 17 km from town. Pebble-sand mix, steep. Quiet and close to a golf resort.

Dassia Beach, Corfu, Ideal for Families and Water Lovers

Barbati Corfu Clear Seas and Scenic Hillside Charm

Northeast coast. Pebble Beach, deep waters. Stunning views, upscale feel.
